**Main issues raised in kick off remarks. What's the focus of the session?**

**The session's focus was the tensions and issues created by global transparency norms projects. When are they appropriate, where have they worked well, and where do norms need to exist? How can we design good collaboration among NGOs, and what are we working toward together?**

**What initiatives have been showcased? Briefly describe the Game Changing Strategies**

**The initiatives discussed include EITI, IATI, the Natural Resources Charter, OGP, new open data projects, OpenCorporates, the Construction Sector Transparency Initiative, UNCAC.**

**Highlights: What are the main outcomes of this session? What's next?**

**The main outcomes of this session is to have articulated a clearer expectation and shared understanding from the broader group about where global norms projects make a good contribution to NGOs' work, and where they face serious limitations. We left with a better understanding of how we should work together, and of the limitations of coalitions and broad thematic work.**
